## Memorandum of Understanding

## Between

## Eurasian International Medical University Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan and Foundation For Peace, Lahore, Pakistan

WHEREAS, EIMU is an institution of higher learning in health sciences. It is recognized by World Health Organization and the Ministry of Education & Science of the Kyrgyz Republic. It offers courses in Doctor of Medicine (MD).

WHEREAS FFP is a Trust, registered under Trust Act 1882 of Pakistan. It is dedicated to promoting education, training and scholarship in emerging fields of sciences and humanities in pursuit of peace and harmony among cultures, societies and nations.

AND WHEREAS the objective of this Memorandum of Understanding is to create conditions for cooperation between the Parties in the field of education, training, research and allied subjects.

NOW THEREFORE this Memorandum of Understanding witnesses as follows:

- The two Parties undertake to work together and carryout the following academic activities:
  - a. Joint education and training programs.
  - b. Joint research projects and publications, including work by undergraduate, graduate, and Doctoral students.
  - c. Joint conferences, seminars, and workshops.
  - d. Team taught courses, including online courses.
  - e. Any other form of activity that may be jointly decided upon by the Parties.
- The education programs to be carried out under this Memorandum of Understanding shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- a. Doctor of Medicine (MD).
- Any other program or service related to the teaching, training, consultancy including distant learning and online courses.
- To achieve this noble objective, Eurasian International Medical University and Foundation for Peace undertake to cooperate in the following manner:
  - a. The Eurasian International Medical University will award the following to the Foundation for Peace:
    - i. The rights to establish EIMU's campus (es) in Pakistan.
    - ii. The rights to launch the programs referred to at para two above in Pakistan.
    - iii. The rights to award degree (s) as per the terms and conditions as agreed upon by the Parties
    - The curriculums, syllabuses, teaching materials and allied resources and services, as required.
    - All licenses, permits, permissions, certificates and connected documents, duly authenticated by the competent authority, for submission to the regulatory authorities of Pakistan.
    - vi. Any other document or service that may be required to meet the regulatory requirements and obtain license, permit, permission or any other form of consent of authorities of Pakistan.
    - vii. Advice, guidance, assistance, and any and all other forms of services as necessary to realize the aims and objectives of this Memorandum of Understanding.
  - b. The EIMU will help FFP train faculty, support staff and allied human resource in areas and subjects as relevant to the successful launch and sustaining of the cooperation.
  - The EIMU will provide facilities like access to library resources, research journals and other sources of guidance.
  - d. Both the parties will provide opportunities for their researchers, scholars and experts to access facilities at both institutions for research and development purposes.
  - e. Both the Parties will encourage the participation and visits of students and scholars to each other's institutions.
  - Both the Parties will share the income accrued from the academic and allied activities to be agreed separately.
- 4. The following principles shall guide the Parties in the execution of this MOU:
  - a. Close co-operation in developing and execution of the programs while respecting each party's mandate, roles and responsibilities.
  - Openness, transparency, equity and accountability to identify and resolve issues.
  - c. Optimal sharing of knowledge, expertise, and resources for the benefit of both parties and for the realization of the objective of this agreement.
- In case of any ambiguity and dispute, the matter shall be resolved with mutual consent and in the event of its non-resolution, referred to the arbitrator as per

prevalent laws of Pakistan, who shall decide the dispute according to the provisions of the prevalent Arbitration Act.

- Financial arrangements and stipulations under this agreement will be subjected to individual agreements on a case-by-case basis and are to be specifically described in detail in separate addenda.
- The two institutions recognize mutual credit transfers as per policy and rules of the regulatory institutions of both countries.
- Modifications and amendments to this agreement can be made by mutual consent.
- Should either institution wishes to terminate this agreement, a written notice shall be required to be given Thirty Six (36) months in advance of the desired termination date.
- This Memorandum of Understanding will enter into effect from the date duly signed by the designated officials of the respective Institutions.
- It will remain effective for Ten (10) years, and will stand extended for another Ten (10) year period as long as neither party expresses a desire to terminate or modify this Memorandum of Understanding.
